What to plant

Nothing says "Spring" more than greens - beautiful greens: Arugula, corn salad, cress, kale, collards, mustard and spinach can all be directly sowed now. Carrots, peas and rutabaga can go in as well.

If you haven't already done so, a few spoonfuls of lime on the soil will help to lower the PH. After applying, give it a good watering and let integrate for a week or so before planting.
